PRESIDENTS PARAS

Progress on the Hall completion has slowed down due to weather. However, we still see the regular workers turning up. We have completed cladding the storeroom and kitchen. Hank has been flashing in the area - he tells me its a metal bashing art. Much to the surprise of some of us, the toilet blocks are coming up quite smart - will be a pity to put them into use.

Or try to deliver a letter to your own box for a quick change of heart.

COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION NOTES

- The next meeting (A General Meeting) will be held at the Hall on TUESDAY 28th AUGUST, 1984 at 8 PM.
This is your chance to have a say in the WCA.
- The spread of private signs along Norton Road is somewhat unsightly. However, we appreciate the need to put up a notice if a dog is lost etc. We would urge the removal of the sign after a period of perhaps 7 days. The placing of business/commercial signs is against Shire policy.
- The Shire Engineer recommends a reverse 'U' frame be placed at North Western corner of Norton Road and Gallagher Crescent. A notice board promulgating short term notices important to the Community to be attached when required.

At the Executive Meeting held 31 July, 1984:

- Due to an objection as to the siting of a Community notice board, the President was asked to liaise with the Engineer as regards position/design. (see above).
- An additional \$2000 has been requested to complete the Hall.
- Scouts/Cubs to pay \$160 per annum for permanent Thursday and Friday night hire of the Hall.
- Fire Brigade to pay \$25 per annum for permanent first Tuesday of each month plus general meetings.
- Scouts to pay \$200 to cover cost of Scouts Store room.
- Ross Clay advised of Pony Club activities.
- Hall licence discussed.
- Hall and area booked by Fire Brigade for the Phil Hardy Cup on 3 November, 1984.
- David Robertson advised Legacy Fun Day and Dance (SEPT. 8).
- Discussion on a 'Community use' notice board at the Hall.
- Request 'Community Hall' and 'Fire Shed' road signs in Norton Road.
- Concern expressed re private signs on Norton Road.

Pony Club members will hold a monster working bee on Saturday 1st. September to help prepare grounds for the Legacy Day being held on 8th September. Our members will organize pony rides for that day.
