BUSHFIRE BRIGADE NOTES

It is customary to thank all, and not mention anyone by name but I must thank Bob White, Ricky Berlee, Ian Linnet, The Scouts and my go-fers.

For those who didn't attend you missed quite an action filled and interesting day. Its not often you can see fathers, grandfathers, children, Shire Councillors, teenagers, experienced and inexperienced bushfire fighters (male and female) competing against one another, showing skills learnt (and sometimes forgotten) using the equipment (which sometimes didn't work) used to fight fires in an atmosphere of fun and competition which got keener as the day progressed.

The Shire President whilst presenting prizes, stated that he would recommend that Shire in future run the day with all Brigades attending because it was a good test of equipment, and the men who operate it, just prior to the bushfire season.

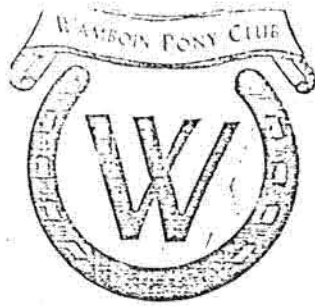
