The Great Insurance Question At its last general meeting, Bywong Community members decided that annual premiums of between \$2000 and \$3000 were higher than the Community could or should pay. Following consideration of advice from the Department of Fair Trading and from private legal sources, they decided not to take out public liability insurance for the coming year.

Lost in Wamboin/Bywong? Bywong Community has piggy-backed on an initiative by Wamboin Community Association by buying at cost two of the all-weather maps produced by Wamboin to guide travellers through the intricacies of our localities. These will be erected at the community signs announcing Bywong at Yass River and Smiths Gap.

Wine Tour The Community's popular annual wine tour will take place on 20 September and will include a new winery - Lambert's - in Wamboin. There are still some places left. Sue Gorham (6236 9476) is taking bookings.

Shire amalgamation In the face of various proposals from other local government bodies, the Community decided to make submissions to the Boundaries Commission reaffirming its supports for the 'lifestyle' shire proposed by Yarrowlumla Shire. Members rejected the second proposal by Yarrowlumla for amalgamation with Queanbeyan.

Business, Arts and Trades Day The Committee as yet has no indication of whether the absence of insurance will affect this event. Members decided to conduct an informal poll of last year's participants to gauge the level of enthusiasm for repeating the event this year. # YARROWLUMLA COUNCIL NEWS

**Local Government Amalgamations** The NSW Boundaries Commission has completed its first round of investigations into the possible dissolution of Yarrowlumla Shire and carving it up between Queanbeyan and Yass. They have recently advertised for submissions into other possibilities for amalgamation as proposed by our Council and others. The Yarrowlumla proposal for a "lifestyle" shire is gaining support. This current enquiry will take some time and I expect that it will be well into October before we get a decision.

Wamboin Rural Fire Brigade As reported last month construction of the extension to the fire station is well under way. We are working towards getting it to lock-up stage as soon as possible so that it can be used for this fire season which commences in only a few weeks. The current fire station was completed fifteen years ago and Wamboin/Bywong has virtually doubled in size since then and we now have an increased fleet of fire tankers and other vehicles needing accommodation. Fund raising for the project is continuing as well as for the normal running expenses of the Brigade. The Brigade is seeking support from the Council and will also be applying for a Government grant. However local support is vital and the Brigade will be collecting donations over the next two months. Your generous support would be very much appreciated.

**New Playground Equipment** Council will be spending about \$22,000 in September on replacing the playground equipment at the Bingley Way hall. Following a recent safety audit it was discovered that the existing equipment no longer met Australian standards and would need to be replaced. After consultation with the Playgroup (the most regular users) an option was chosen and an order has been placed.

**Wamboin Winery** Council has given final approvals and operating hours for the Lambert Winery on Norton Rd. This is a magnificent development and will be a great, high quality attraction for Wamboin and the wine industry in the Canberra region. Lambert wines have already had success with medals in recent wine shows and the winery and café should prove very popular with locals and tourists. I congratulate Steve and Ruth and wish them luck for their outstanding achievement

**Robberies** We seem to continue to suffer burglaries in Wamboin and Bywong with recent reports of homes being burgled. If you have any information or perhaps think that we should have a neighbourhood watch program in this area then send me an email or a phone call. # **Amalgamation of Shires**

Despite hands-off promises prior to the last election, the NSW Government is pursuing a policy of amalgamating smaller municipalities and shires. On the 12<sup>th</sup> of May 2003 the Queanbeyan City Council requested the transfer of 155 sq km of the Yarrowlumla Shire to the City of Queanbeyan. The NSW Minister for Local Government then proposed transferring Western Yarrowlumla to the Yass Shire and Eastern Yarrowlumla to Queanbeyan City. At last count there were about 17 variations to this proposal including a Yass takeover of Sutton, Wamboin and Bywong. After the June meeting of the WCA, where we were addressed by the Mayors of Yarrowlumla, Queanbeyan and Yass, we made a written submission to the Local Government Boundaries Commission passing on the preferences decided at the meeting. The fact that our community orientated area would be far outnumbered (and thus outvoted) by Queanbeyan or Yass residents was cause for concern. The large 'Rural Lifestyle Shire' involving the amalgamation of Yarrowlumla and Tallaganda local government areas and boundary alterations to include the south and south-eastern portions of Mulwaree, Gunning and Yass local government areas, as presented by Mayor Bransdon was the favoured choice.

The Gunning Shire contacted Sutton, Bywong and Wamboin Associations and a meeting with members of the Gunning Shire Council was arranged for the 29<sup>th</sup> of July. The Gunning Mayor, Laurie Willett, presented a proposal which varied from the Yass and Queanbeyan plan in that the new shire (the present Gunning Shire plus Sutton, Wamboin, Bywong, Bungendore and Lake George area) would comprise of three wards each with 3 Councillors. With everyone chasing us as though we were the 'prodigal son' why this feeling that we were more like the 'fatted calf'?

Why is our area so in demand? I believe Gunning Shire is worried about being taken over by Yass or Goulburn. Yass Shire claim is that they want control of their water catchment area however I suspect the amount collected in rates has a lot to do with us being so vigorously courted. In return for our considerable rates we get road upkeep and...and...and... just a minute, I'm thinking.

We received a letter back from the Boundaries Commission acknowledging receipt of our submission and saying how they would 'make recommendations as to whether either Queanbeyan City Council's proposal or the Minister's proposal should be implemented'. This was a bit of a shock and left us wondering if any of the other proposals had received a hearing. We were assured that the Commission could only make recommendation on these set proposals and others would follow.

John Van der Straaten and I arranged a visit to the local member, Steve Whan, where we discussed our concern. He said he would look into the matter however he pointed out he considered the Queanbeyan amalgamation option was well accepted. Judging from the WCA vote Wamboinians don't agree with him!

On the 12<sup>th</sup> of August two notices from the Boundaries Commission in the Canberra Times requested comment on the Yass & Gunning Proposals. Both Shires propose taking over the Sutton, Wamboin, Bywong areas with the Yass option extending to Wallaroo and the Gunning one extending to take in Bungendore and Lake George.

At our 19<sup>th</sup> of August meeting the WCA decided to respond to the Boundaries Commission to again make it clear that we preferred to maintain our community orientated way of life and thus the 'Rural Lifestyle Shire' was our preferred option.

On the 20<sup>th</sup> of August a notice from the Boundaries Commission in the Canberra Times requested comment on the 'Rural Lifestyle Shire' and an alternative 'Regional Council'. This alternative option involves the amalgamation of Queanbeyan, Yass, Tallaganda and Gunning local government areas. Written submissions from persons with an interest in putting forward points of view relating to the proposal were invited. The WCA will respond as decided at our recent meetings.

There is a light at the end of the tunnel. (Hopefully it is not a train coming the other way!) The Wamboin Hall has been booked for local government elections for the 20<sup>th</sup> of March 2004. Perhaps by then we will know **who** is standing for **what** council?

# From the Captain's Desk

Even though we spend a lot of time organising regular training sessions during the year, the response from some of our members has not been ideal. We all need to start thinking seriously about our own level of training and preparedness for the next fire season. I encourage all members of the brigade to take advantage of any of the three training sessions this month and get back into it. The memories of January this year are still very vivid. We need to think that it could happen again and get some practice. We need to get familiar with the trucks and all the associated equipment. Contact your Deputy Captain and make sure you are ready.

Property owners in our community should be looking at their properties and asking some serious questions about being prepared. Advice has been included in this month's article about some of the things that can be done. If you need advice please contact me or one of the field officers listed below. We will be only too happy to pay a visit. If you need to undertake any hazard reduction on your property you will need to contact Jeff Shalders, the district's Fire Mitigation Officer, beforehand to arrange a hazard reduction permit. These permits are required now at any time of the year. If you then wish to reduce the hazards by burning you will also need to get a fire permit next month. Your neighbours will also need to be notified whatever time of the year you undertake a hazard reduction by burning. A potentially embarrassing visit from your fire brigade can be avoided if you also contact me before your burn this month even though you will not need a fire permit. A lot of information about hazard reductions is available from the Rural Fire Service website, http://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au. Residents are warned that several fires have occurred in the past few days on the South Coast. Over 200 RFS volunteers recently attended more than 40 separate fires in the Bega Valley, Eurobodalla and Shoalhaven Districts.

200 RFS volunteers recently attended more than 40 separate fires in the Bega Valley, Eurobodalla and Shoalhaven Districts. Many were private property hazard reduction burns that escaped under strong wind conditions. These winds were forecasted and were widely advertised.

### **Brigade Donation Drive**

Even though we all pay a levy in our annual rates for the rural fire brigade service in our Shire, the amount of money raised does not fully cover all the costs of running the brigades. The money collected from the rates is supplemented on a ratio of 8 to 1 by the State Government and it is this money that buys fire brigade vehicles, buys fuel, provides personal protective equipment for the fire fighters, pays for vehicle maintenance, and funds the purchase of other equipment. However, there are many things that still need to be provided so that your brigade can help protect this community. Things such as better radios, new first aid kits, tools, rations and supplies, security systems, a winch for the hose drying mast, and the extensions to the fire shed still have to be funded by us, the members of this community. We will be out on the roads collecting your donations this year on 11 and 18 of October this year. Please give generously because in the end the whole community benefits from a better fire brigade.

# Is Your Property Prepared Against Bush Fire and Grass Fires?

### Check that:

- Ground fuels are kept clear around the house (long, dry grass, dead leaves and branches, thick undergrowth)
- Gutters are cleared.
- Roofing is firmly fixed (cleaned of dry leaf debris).
- Firebreaks are prepared, (a well watered lawn can act as a firebreak).
- Screens or shutters are installed and underfloor areas enclosed, if possible.

- Vents into roof space are screened with fine wire mesh
- Flammable items are removed from around the house, (eg. woodpiles, and obvious flammable materials such as paper, boxes, crates, hanging baskets, wooden garden furniture etc).
- LPG gas tanks are vented away from house. Emergency 000 telephone number is placed near the phone.

# Do you have sufficient Water Supplies and Fire Fighting Equipment? Check that:

- Hoses are long enough to reach all sides of house, and attached to taps.
- Heavy-duty hoses are fitted with wide-spray nozzles, if possible.
- Reserve water supplies from tanks, dams, or swimming pools, are available, if possible, since mains water will be in high demand. Try to store water during winter months.
- Gate valves are fitted to water tanks. (a 38mm Storz coupling will assist the Rural Fire Brigade).
- Have a gate valve to fit portable pump as well
- Regularly check petrol or diesel portable pumps, if you have one, to ensure it starts easily.
- Install a sprinkler system in your garden and on roofing, if affordable.
- Gather buckets (preferably metal), mops, spray backpack units, ladders rakes and shovels and store them in one place for ready access during a fire.
- Battery operated radios and torches should be kept in case of electricity failure.

# **Sutton Residents Doubtful About Proposed Development**

Sutton residents who answered a survey are not keen on a plan to develop 2000 house sites next to their village. Of 102 Sutton and district residents who responded to the survey, 62 opposed the development, 20 supported it, and 21 were undecided.

Following the survey and a workshop held in the village, Sutton and District Community Association is advising Yarrowlumla Council that it opposes the current proposal for the rezoning of the 800 hectare site which a developer has bought and is seeking to re-zone.

The Community Association will ask all regional shires to defer any rezoning action until a vision and management plan are completed. The Association will also ask the developer to arrange a presentation to a general meeting on the proposed development before Council considers the rezoning application.

Members of a working group of the Association are disappointed that the developer has not provided more specific details about the proposed development to the community. They have urged all members of the community to attend the proposed public meeting with the developer. - Guy Cotsell

# Geary's Gap/Wamboin Landcare -- NATIVE GRASSES

Preserving and restoring our native grasses can be of benefit not only to our own properties but also to the wider environmental region. They work for us in many ways, helping to prevent erosion and provide soil stability while increasing rainfall infiltration into the soil. They help ensure a catchment filtration system for water before entering dams and creeks, provide understory habitat and combat salinity. They also offer low-cost landscaping, a microhabitat for other native flowers and used wisely and sensitively can provide more than adequate grazing especially during drier seasons.

Until recently native grasses were thought to have little value for grazing or conservation and were replaced with introduced pastures. Their excellent resistance to drought and low temperatures went largely unacknowledged as was the fact that they are generally better suited to acid soils. Native grasses like those listed below respond to grazing, are green either year-long or in dry seasons and have good forage value.

Identifying native grasses can be difficult especially with some pest species such as serrated tussock bearing a strong resemblance to some of our local species. Four dominant local species are **Kangaroo Grass** (*Themeda ausrtalis*), **Wallaby Grass** (*austrodanthonia*), **Corkscrew Grasses** (*Austrostipa*) and **Snow Grass & River Tussock** (*Poa spp*). When revegetating, try to select the species that already grow on your property and therefore suit your soil and environment.

There are several good resources available to assist in identification. Try NSW Agriculture, DLWC, CSIRO who have a valuable reference CD called 'AusGrass' or specialized outlets such as the Botanic Gardens bookshop. I noticed that Bungendore's very own bookshop, 'A Suitable Book' is also stocking some valuable environmental resources for this area. When all else fails, bring along a specimen (with flowers, fruits or seed heads if possible) to a Landcare meeting and one of our 'experts' will give you a hand.

Cultivating and harvesting native grasses for their seed is a relatively recent development, prompted by demand initially for potted plants by the nursery trade for landscaping and use in water purification schemes such as wetland rehabilitation, dams and along new roadsides. At the last Landcare meeting, **Warren Saunders** from **Seeds & Plants Australia**, talked about the business of collecting seeds either for personal use on our own properties or for commercial gain. There are issues with taking seed from the bush, so collecting from existing plants on your own property is suggested. The actual harvest time may vary from season to season with both seed set and ripening depending on day length, moisture availability and temperature, however most seed is 'ripe' around Christmas time. Use the 'crunch' test for determining if the seed is ripe – the seed should be white and nutty inside. Even within a limited area, some swards will be slower to set seed than others. The *Florabank* publications detail principles of collection and storage.

There is a market being established for native grass seed. See <a href="www.stipa.com.au">www.stipa.com.au</a> for information about growing and selling. Perhaps there is some scope for someone setting up a small "garden" where seed can be commercially harvested?. *Poa* seed fetches about \$70 /kg and a single plant can produce about 100g each season. Careful selection of species may mean that you can harvest successive crops from an area containing mixed species which ripen at different times.

# **NSW Cervical Screening Program**

Women between the ages of 50 and 69 years living in the Yarrowlumla Shire are under-screened for cervical cancer, according to data collected by the NSW Cervical Screening Program. There could be many reasons for this. Some women may not have accessed the services offered due to lack of information; some may lack access to these services and yet others may have decided they do not need a test. Although death rates from cervical cancer have decreased steadily since the Australian Government introduced the screening program in 1972, the reality is that women are still dying from this and other cancers. It is now well established that the earlier abnormal cells are detected via a quick, simple and effective test known as a 'Pap smear', the easier it is to prevent cancer developing. Stephanie Williams is the Southern Area Health Service's Cervical Screening project officer. She wants to make contact with women aged 50-69 years in your area who are interested in looking after their good health, learning more about cervical screening tests, and promoting their own wellbeing. ### IF ONLY THEY COULD TALK

A new series by local vet, Dr Garry McComb BVSc ODAH

It is Sunday 24 August 24 and this morning I was supposed to be going horse riding for the first time in months however it was raining and so our ride was cancelled. Instead I wrote an article on rumen overload for the various newsletters. As the day progressed the weather deteriorated to the point of being one of the most miserable we have had in years - and don't we just love all this rain. We have had so much today that Margie just went down to the dam to check the level. We have a fire fighting pump stationed under the jetty and this afternoon it became a submersible pump! I have retrieved it and hopefully it will be working before next fire season.

Because of the weather I decided to write a different article for this month (at least I will be early with next month's article). It is this type of weather that causes us to see so much pregnancy toxaemia - commonly known as twin lamb disease. This is a very serious and often fatal disease of sheep and goats. It occurs only in pregnancy, usually during the last month of pregnancy in ewes/nannies carrying more than one lamb/kid, although a single large foetus may be enough to promote the condition. The most common precipitating cause is a prolonged and gradual fall in the plane of nutrition as we normally see in this environment at this time of year. Cold inclement weather and absence of shelter also markedly increase the incidence. Other forms of stress such as crutching, shearing or trucking can also cause an outbreak of the disease.

Signs of this disease may include some or all of the following: Separation from the flock, Apparent blindness - alert bearing but disinclination to move, Head pressing, Constipation, Teeth grinding, Drowsiness, Nervous signs - tremors, circling, salivation, convulsions, "star gazing" and other abnormal postures, A smell of ketones on the breath. The affected animal becomes recumbent for a few days and will die without treatment. Treatment needs to be early and aggressive and in valuable animals may include a Caesarian section. Mildly affected animals usually have difficulty with parturition.

As with most diseases prevention is more effective than cure and consideration should be given to all of the following: Providing shelter; An increasing plane of nutrition in the last 6 weeks of pregnancy - providing extra concentrates if necessary and especially during periods of bad weather; Reducing stress; Regular exercise especially for well fed animals.

On our farm we have found another way of preventing Pregnancy Toxaemia this year - we did not join. So on nights like tonight Margie and I will not be lying awake worrying about goats succumbing to this depressing disease. The down side to this approach is that there will be no kids bounding about our front paddocks this year however with the drought and the cost of lupins, I am glad that we and our herd are not under this stress. Our apologies to all who enjoy seeing our kids as you drive by.
