Wamboin Community Association President's Paragraphs

Humble Apologies – for missing the deadline for the June issue of the Whisper. The one time in seven event that the end of the month is in the middle of the weekend confused me!

Palerang Council – The WCA made submissions to Council on both the Rural Residential, Rural and Environmental Areas Discussion Paper and the 2008-09 Draft Management Plan (DMP) and Budget. A number of WCA members also attended the Council meeting on 26 June where the DMP and Budget was adopted.

Palerang Council Election – The Local Council elections are looming. They will be held on 13 September 2008. There has been a fair bit of publicity in the Bungendore Mirror about the election and a number of people from other parts of the Shire (including Braidwood and Bungendore) have already indicated their intention to stand for election. It is imperative that the areas of Wamboin and Bywong (and other areas such as Carwoola and Burra) have adequate representation on the new Council. The WCA is still keen to facilitate the formation of a local ticket for the election. Nominations are only open from 4th to 13th August, so there isn't much time to get a ticket organised. If you are interested in standing for Council, or know of anybody who might be, please contact John van der Straaten (ph: 6238 3590) or Helen Montesin (ph: 6238 3208). A number of WCA members attended the Candidate Information Session conducted by the NSW Electoral Commission on 28th June. There will be another candidate information session for prospective councillors on 14th July at 7:00pm at the Queanbeyan City Council Chambers, 253 Crawford St, Queanbeyan which will be conducted jointly by the Palerang and Queanbeyan Councils.

The WCA intends to host a 'Meet the Candidates' information session, where candidates will be able to inform us what they plan to do on Council and to listen to our concerns and issues. It will probably be held in conjunction with the August WCA meeting (19th August at 7:30pm at the Community Hall).





Norton Road – After many years of lobbying Council, there has been some (albeit small) improvement on Norton Road. The big dip in the road near the Yass River crossing has been fixed which is a great appreciated. Surveyors have started work on the section between Bingley Way and Merinovale Drive which is to be reconstructed in the 2008-9 financial year. While there is much more to be done, it is great to see some progress.

WCA Meeting – Everybody is most welcome to attend the next WCA meeting on 15th July at 7:30pm at the Community Hall.

Curry Night – Make a date in your diary for Wamboin's gastronomical delight of the year which will be on 16th August.

Wamboin Produce Markets – After a very successful season, the markets are now in recess until spring. The next markets will be on **20**th **September** from 9:00am until noon.

At the same time the WCA was organising to make The Whisper available on a yahoo newsgroup, others were having similar thoughts about a Wamboin community-based website; something which might also provide issues of The Whisper in electronic form.

Many times at my computer at home, or at work, I wanted to look up a business contact number, or recall the details of an interesting article from The Whisper, and the absence of a handy hard-copy or an electronic copy, was of increasing annoyance... So much so that I set about rectifying the situation by drafting a demo website that could be accessed by anyone, anywhere connected to the Internet. A sample site to test the waters.

As the web pages developed it was clear that the site could become much more than an electronic mailbox -- it could be a dynamic, interactive site, that dove-tails neatly with community needs. Something that both complements and enhances the efforts of The Whisper itself.

What the site may or may not become is yet to be determined, but what is now available is an endorsed website for the delivery of current & historical issues of The Whisper in PDF format. Access to the site is unrestricted and requires no registration. Electronic copies of The Whisper should be available online a few days before the paper version is delivered to your door. Around 5 years of back issues will hopefully be available for download shortly.

Like most websites, this new website is "A work in progress", experimental, however the site is functional and available to use. Download help is available online. The URL of the new website is (http://thewhisper.freehosting.net). Thanks go to Ned Noel, Pete Harrison and the Wamboin Community Association for participating and endorsing the new website.

From the Captain's Desk



At the risk of sounding like a repeating CD (I am not sure that the expression "sounding like a broken record" is relevant any more); last month was a quiet one for your brigade. The weather has been having a great influence on this in more ways than the obvious. Not only is it keeping the risks of bushfires to a minimum, but I can only guess that with the mild conditions in the mountains the number of cars with those flattish sticks, boards and poles strapped to the roof is less than this time last year. The bottom line is very few callouts. However, that hasn't stopped the pagers from going off in response to reports of fires that residents have lit but failed to notify their neighbours or their local fire brigade. While I can only thank those many people who have either called me or Andrew Dunn, our Senior Deputy Captain, the Fire Control Centre in Queanbeyan, and notified their neighbours about burn-offs and bonfires, there are a few people who have not

yet got the message. Just this week we were called to help with a reported bushfire in an adjoining brigade's area.

Our loyal reader may be asking if it was possible to have a bushfire this time of the year but with the right time of day and a decent wind there is enough ground fuel to create a few headaches. As it turned out we were stood down after a short while because the bushfire turned out to be a windrow being burned off. This didn't stop the alarm being raised, a response initiated and volunteers called out. Prior notification could have prevented the response but as you can imagine we could not take the chance and the report had to be investigated.

While on the subject of incidents, I should add a few words about the picture of the damaged car that appeared in last month's edition. I can confirm that there was a collision between the sedan pictured and a utility; not a steam roller! I suspect the article succumbed to a little known computer affliction that pops up now and again when we send messages through the Internet ether, Intermittent Format Dysfunction.

With the arrival of winter, we need to remind everyone about the dangers of house fires and urge you to take precautions. Superintendent Nick Turner, Manager of Lake George Rural Fire Zone said recently that "Last winter across NSW, ten people lost their lives and 188 people were injured in home fires. Lake George volunteer brigades attended 16 house fires from May to September last year." Many winter house fires can be prevented by taking a few simple precautions:

- Never leave heaters or fireplaces unattended.
 Ensure things like curtains and blankets are kept well clear of sources of heat or fire.
- ✓ If you are drying clothes indoors, do it safely by cleaning your dryer's lint filter and never placing clothes close to a heater.
- ✓ Always keep watch on pots and pans because it only takes a few moments for a fire to start and spread.
- ✓ Ensure your smoke alarm is working properly.
- ✓ Prepare and practice your evacuation plan.

The brigade held its Annual General Meeting last month. I would like to thank all the visitors we had at the meeting and Superintendent Nick Turner for acting as the Returning Officer and his words of encouragement and thanks to the brigade members. The results of the elections mean that we won't have to arrange for a new photograph of the Captain for the Whisper article just yet! Except for Nev Schroder, all the field officers from last year were re-elected. They are Andrew Dunn, Senior Deputy Captain; Richard Hobbs, Geoff Foster, Darrell Tipton and Dave Cochrane, Deputy Captains. Wendy Downs was again elected as our Support Crew Coordinator.

During the AGM the brigade was able to show its appreciation to the Wonderful Women of Wamboin for the invaluable support they have provided to our members during the past year. I also had the pleasure of presenting the Captain's Award to Ian Coillet to acknowledge the fantastic work he has been doing as the brigade's secretary. I can't keep the thread; I'm forever losing the plot. And then there are the images that simply overwhelm and I wonder if we've all lost the plot. Tragic pictures of people, their lives shattered by earthquakes and floods, pathetic wide eyed children with swollen bellies, weeping women swathed in black with sad eyed men and children against a back drop of smoke and rubble. And these images are not always from far off places. Some of them are in our own back yard.

With the days closing in early and the sun reluctant to get up in the morning, winter can be a gloomy time for some. I am, however, one of the lucky ones, able to get outside, to walk with numb fingers and an icy nose, and to see and breathe in and listen to the richness of the world around us. And when it all seems "too much" and our prospects bleak, a walk through the bush can be a wonderful tonic. We don't have to wait until spring!

I wouldn't live anywhere else....how fortunate we are.


