


New Committee Office Bearers for Bywong Community Association. Two new office bearers were elected at our last Executive meeting on 23 June 2009.

Wamboin 15 Years Ago

From the Whisper of July, 1994, circulation 390, in the Community Association Report: "The June meeting considered a proposal to apply for a grant from the Department of Sport and Recreation. Money is available in this International Year of the Family to assist community groups with the building of playgrounds. Playgroup parents have been working on a plan to open the community hall up to an enclosed play area on the north side, away from the danger of the dam and car park. The concept is for an environmentally sympathetic 'adventure playground'."

"As a condition of the grant applicants must contribute at least half the cost of the project, made up in dollars as well as in labour and materials. The WCA will contribute \$500 and we will probably have a contribution from the Yarrowlumla Shire Council."



A long weekend and dodgy weather but still a good turn out to the Wamboin golf competition on 7th June.



ANTICHINUS - WHAT'S THAT?

Often confused with rats, mice and other rodents, our region is home to a small marsupial (has a pouch) called Antichinus. There are several different types in Australia, but a couple of the more common ones around here are the Yellow-footed and Brown Antechinus. Wildcare doesn't come across too many of these animals – perhaps because development and domestic animals have moved them on. But they occasionally turn up. Typically they are brought home by the family cat. Unfortunately cats have a particularly damaging and infectious bite and this is often fatal unless antibiotics can be given quickly. It is not always easy to identify Antichinus, but compared to other rodent-type animals, it has splayed feet, a more pointed snout and double-lobed ears.

Being mainly nocturnal, you have to be lucky to see them in the wild. However they can be seen during the day during the mating season in July/August. Females give birth to as many as 12 young. And the male dies shortly after mating – it is at this time they are 'rescued', as they are more vulnerable. Mum is often partial to eating her young, so they can be pretty tough on each other. They can live around our homes, but typically they live in woodland areas in tree cavities and rocks. It has an odd rapid and jerky hopping style and is a fast mover. It has quite a varied diet including insects, fruit and flowers, but it is also carnivorous and can eat small birds and mice. And it can be cheeky in pinching food from the kitchen and garbage bins.

There are many native wildlife rodent-like creatures, so don't always assume you have found a rat or large mouse. One way to help protect smaller mammals is

to keep cats under control, particularly at night. Wildcare is your local wildlife group and can be contacted on 6299 1966. The Native Animal Rescue Group covers the Braidwood and Majors Creek area on 4846 1900.



WASTE MANAGEMENT SURVEY

The Waste Management Survey by the Palerang/Wamboin/Bywong/Sutton East Waste Management Working Group was distributed to the ratepayers of the three communities on 17 June. It was the culmination of a lot of work by Palerang Council's Director of Infrastructure Planning, Bill Ellison, Councillors Terry Bransdon, Anne Goonan and Judith Turley and representatives from our three Community Associations. The Working Group endeavoured to give residents detailed information on their waste management options once Macs Reef tip is closed.

The survey will have closed by the time you read this article so I hope that you took the time to consider your preferred option and sent your survey form in by the deadline of 3 July. School holidays and Council agenda necessitated a quickish turn-round time. 1236 survey packages were sent out and, at time of writing, there has been quite a high return rate. A good response will, of course, indicate community interest in their local amenities and confound the critics of such a community consultation process. An interim report will go to Council on 2 July.

The next step will entail the collation and analysis of the results. I anticipate that their interpretation will interest, and create much discussion, for Councillors and residents in determining the positions they will adopt. I can only hope for open minds and lateral thinking. The recent Council meeting which discussed the costs for operating the Captains Flat transfer station brings into focus the costs to Palerang Council and to Palerang ratepayers for such a community amenity for a much smaller population than the Wamboin, Bywong and Sutton East area.

It is anticipated that an agreed analysis from the Working Group will be reported to Council at the August General meeting. -- John van der Straaten, WCA Secretary 6238 3590





Nature Notes June 2009

A few good falls of rain during the month have combined with very mild temperatures to create ideal growing conditions for the winter grasses. And it looks as if it is going to be a good season for some of the daisies that prefer moister sites. Billy Buttons (*Craspedia variabilis*) are coming up along the creek and Scaly Buttons (*Leptorhynchos squamatus*) rosettes are appearing in large patches. A daisy that wasn't very common on my place when I came here years ago is Austral Bear's-ear (*Cymbonotus lawsonianus*). Over the last few years, though, it has appeared in sizeable populations. The bright green leaves are up to 10cm long and almost as wide, with lobed margins, and form a flat rosette around the almost stalkless bright yellow flowers, very noticeable during spring and summer.

It's possibly going to be a good year for orchids, too. Certainly, there are large patches of Greenhood rosettes, mostly Little Dumpies (*Diplodium truncatum* – previously *Pterostylis truncata*), coming up at present on my place, and one plant appears to have a small flower bud already. Some of these patches are over a metre across, but so far I've only once seen a really good flowering season.

The Early Wattle (*Acacia genistifolia*) is already in flower in places along Sutton Road, and the buds on the Silver Wattle (*A.dealbata*) are already beginning to show some colour. We could get some early flowerings, unless the temperatures are a bit closer to normal next month – so far there have been only about four frosts here and those very light. It hasn't been cold enough yet for the Wolf Spiders to close over their holes in the ground for winter.

There are a few winter visitors amongst the birds. A Yellow-tufted Honeyeater has claimed a group of grevilleas near the dam, and was busy keeping the Eastern Spinebills at bay recently. Two Satin Bowerbirds turned up close to the house the other day. Neither had the blue-black plumage of a male, so they were probably either two females or, possibly, immature birds. Immature males have similar plumage to females for two or three years, then begin to develop a green band across the chest. After this, they gradually produce the blue-black feathers, but are six or seven years old before full adult plumage is obtained. And a pair of Pink Robins flew in and sat in a bush close to me when I was cutting up one of the dead Silver Wattles. The male came to almost within arm's length, perched on a twig watching intently, then dived on a small insect I must have disturbed.

With just a little bit more rain, the countryside should stay green until spring. Right now there is more rain forecast. Let's hope it happens.
