Hall and Fireshed electrical upgrade – The work has now been completed for the upgrade to the electrical supply to the Fireshed and Hall; and the new lights in the Hall. Many thanks to Peter Greenwood and the rest of his team for their hard work in obtaining the funds for this important work and getting the job done.

Noticeboard on corner of Norton and Bungendore Roads –Steve and Jenny Richards have done a great job repairing the noticeboard – thank you both very much. However, I was very disappointed to see that someone had taped a notice on it. Please do not tape signs to any of the noticeboards as the glue ruins the chalkboard surface. In addition, the noticeboards are to be used for notices of a community nature and for 'little dog lost' notices. They are not to be used for commercial or business notices and other notices must not be attached to the noticeboards

Norton and Bungendore Roads – The roadworks are now complete for the sections being upgraded on these roads. They are a great improvement. Palerang Council have done a good job with a minimum of disruption. We hope that they will continue to improve these roads as some sections are in a parlous state.

Suspicious activities – Following a spate of burglaries earlier in the year, there have been some recent reports of suspicious activities in the Wamboin/Bywong area. These involve people driving into properties purporting to be Jehovah's Witnesses. While they may be legitimate, if you see anything that you think is suspicious, you should take note of relevant details and contact the police. Taking photos of the people/car would also be useful. Most mobile phones have a camera function these days, so if you have it handy, you could use that.



Shooting in rural residential areas: fact is, it's dangerous

About 30 people attended the information session on shooting in rural residential areas on Wednesday 14th Oct at the Bywong Hall. Our own local resident Mark Watson (pictured) gave an excellent scientific presentation

on ballistics and why shooting in rural residential areas is extremely dangerous, even for the best prepared and trained shooters.

This was followed up by Stephen Horsley, Regional Manager, South West Slopes Region of the NSW National Parks. National Parks issue all licences for commercial and non-commercial culling of kangaroos, who are a protected species and may not be shot or killed without a valid licence. Mr.Horsley advised that there has now been a change in policy for issuing non-commercial culling licences in rural residential areas. Landholders must have a minimum of 25 hectares to apply for a non-commercial culling licence, and other conditions must be met before a licence may be issued. Acting Inspector Nick Hallett from NSW Police.



Queanbeyan was the final speaker and highlighted legal requirements for all gunholders and said that the Queanbeyan Police are currently conducting an audit of all gunholders, to ensure they are compliant. He stressed the importance of residents contacting police with any concern about shooting incidents, and encouraged residents to persist with getting police follow-up to any concern reported.

Wildcare Spring Snapshot by Phil Machin

Spring has been a mixed bag so far. First it got warm and we started to see lizards, snakes and reptiles scurrying and slithering around; then there was a cold snap and they all must have gone back to sleep; and now it is warming up again with all the wildlife activity that goes with that. Reptiles can't help but use our roads to get warm and motorists must keep a wary eye open to avoid them. Ideally if you see a turtle or lizard on the road – stop the car and move them off in the direction they were headed. For snakes, just stop and let them pass by, whilst alerting other motorists. If you come across an injured reptile, place it in a box and keep it cool and then seek help. If you can't bear the thought of picking up a lizard or turtle, use a towel or piece of cloth to bundle it up. The same can be done for echidnas and to avoid their thorns. In the garden, try to keep dogs and cats under control. If you discover a lizard in the dog run, then move it somewhere else, but nearby. And check that bird netting is off the ground to avoid snakes getting tangled up.

The recent high winds and blustery rain has caused some baby birds to fall out of their nest prematurely. If you come across a baby bird on the ground, just keep an eye on it for a day or so, as it could continue to be fed by its mother on the ground. Only if it looks like it has been permanently abandoned do you need to pick it up and hand it over to a wildlife group. Often baby birds end up on the ground as they learn to fly and haven't quite got the knack.



At this time of the year there are less kangaroos coming into care. There is a lot more grass around for them to eat in safety, albeit some still seem to like to come to the roadsides during dusk and over night to feed. Many young joeys are getting used to being out of mum's pouch and it is another delight of spring to see these little ones making the first few hops.

Wildcare and the Native Animal Rescue Group continue to get a steady stream of baby wombats into care. These are mainly from road kill situations. It is important to check animals on the road to see if there is a Joey onboard or hiding nearby.


The Wamboin Firefighter

BRIGADE ACTIVITY DURING THE MONTH



The other thing you will have noticed is, this Spring has been more typical of the season we used to regularly experience several years ago. Quite a deal of rain. Yes, isn't it green – almost verdant. The rain is very welcome but as you'll already be noticing, a touch of the warm weather and the grass is growing rapidly (i.e. fuel level is building). Be mindful.

Over the next few weeks members of your volunteer fire brigade will be undertaking assessment for advancement to Bush Fire fighter, Village Fire fighter, Advanced Fire fighter, Crew Leader - Village and Crew Leader - Wildfire. I hope you will join me in wishing them well.

PREPARE. ACT. SURVIVE

Are you Prepared to Survive?

The NSW Rural Fire Services (RFS) is posing this question to the NSW community this fire season. All local residents should be seeking answers. After all, what is at stake is the health and well-being of families, friends, animals and property. And, don't forget, the actions and decisions we make as individuals can affect others in the community.

By preparing and executing a properly thought out Plan, you improve your prospect of survival and that of other people in the community within which you reside. So, ask yourself - Am I Prepared to Survive?

- Do I know where to go to get an understanding of what the question means?
- Do I know where to go to find the answers?
- Do I need help to decide on what decisions I should make?

The RFS has developed a stepped process to help ensure your Bush Fire Survival Plan is appropriate for your circumstances. The RFS website (http://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au) has details of what you need to know, and tools and information to help you find the answers you need. Please take the time to become familiar with the updated material on this website. Secondly, in association with the Wamboin Community Association, the Wamboin Fire Brigade has developed new website pages tailored to provide advice and guidance for local residents (http://brigade.wamboincommunity.asn.au). Follow the

'Community Advice' menu link to view information that will help guide you through the process of making your survival plans. The site also augments the local fire danger signs by reporting the local Fire Danger Index online. If you don't travel past the local signs regularly (signs are located on Norton Rd near Sutton Rd intersection, near intersection of Bungendore Rd and Harriott Rd, near intersection of Bungendore Rd and The Mountain Rd, and at Sutton Park near the intersection of the Federal Hwy Service Road and Goolabri Dr), you can use the website to monitor local conditions and brigade announcements.

In the process of making your survival plan decisions. Don't forget to inform your neighbours as well as friends who visit you; and if you have made special plans (e.g. as a neighbouring community group in a remote or difficult area). Please also inform the Wamboin Fire Brigade so that we can help understand your arrangements and situation.

Please have consideration for your neighbours. In the event of a fire emergency – are your neighbours well enough, or fit enough to manage by themselves? Do they need a hand in planning or executing their own survival plans? We can all help each other if we communicate our situation and survival plans with each other.

So you have made a plan to Survive. That's good. But you're not quite finished! Once you have prepared your survival plan (and informed people affected by your plan) - trial it. Does it work? Is it practical? And, remember, your situation could quite possibly change quickly and dramatically depending on what is happening at the time of a bushfire:

- Are all your family members at home? Maybe the kids are at school, or a friend's house, or your husband, wife or partner is at work?
- If there is a fire how far away is it, what is the intensity (fire danger), what direction is it travelling?
- What time of day or night is it, can you see or smell it? Things are much harder to execute in the dark or very smoky conditions will this affect your actions?
- Do you have the same utility services? The phone lines and power could be down, no water supply.
- Do you have family or friends visiting at the time of a fire situation? Are they aware of the dangers? Have you familiarised them with your Survival Plan? It is important for everyone to understand what they should do?
- If you plan to defend your property have you tested all your equipment to make sure it works as expected?

The list of variables that can occur during a fire event are potentially endless. You should be aware of the likely variations that can affect the execution of your plan, and have alternative plans in case the situation changes.

Nature Notes - October 2009



What a wonderful spring, the first really green one we've had for several years. The dams are full, the frogs are calling and laying frothy clusters of eggs – and, we're still getting rain, a good fall of 17 mm last night.

The Early Nancy (*Wurmbea dioica*) got rain just in time to give a good display of maroon-centred white flowers. These are fading now, and it's the turn of the violets (*Viola betonicifolia*) to provide a bit of colour. Common Buttercups (*Ranunculus lappaceus*) are just beginning to flower in the damper grassland areas, and it seems to be a particularly good year for the yellow Bulbine Lilies (*Bulbine bulbosa*).

Something that has surprised me this spring is the number of tiny native annual plants that have colonised bare patches of ground, especially where soil has washed down from higher areas. Two of these – Australian Piert (*Aphanes australiana*) and Spoon Cudweed (*Stuartina muelleri*) – I haven't seen here before, but they are occurring over wide areas this year. The Piert grows to only 4-5 cm tall and has deeply divided hairy leaves and tiny, inconspicuous green flowers and fruit. The Cudweed can grow to about 10 cm tall, but is often smaller in crowded situations. The leaves are greyish-green, and, as one would expect, are spoon-shaped. The tiny greyish flower-heads bear minute blackish flowers. Another annual, one that has been here for many years, is *Cotula australis*. It has bright green pinnate leaves, tiny cream button flowers that develop into nodding heads of green seeds. All three of these can probably take on weed proportions in the vegetable garden, but, in grassland areas they have a useful function as first colonisers helping to repair drought damage.

The birds are still nesting and feeding their chicks – which causes a bit of territorial aggression now and then, especially amongst the various honeyeaters who spend a lot of time and energy chasing their neighbours. The Sulphur-crested Cockatoos seem to prefer teasing the furred inhabitants. Several years ago, there was a cockatoo that picked on a particular kangaroo and made her life difficult by hopping after her and nipping her tail until she took off for a more peaceful place to graze. I was reminded of this the other evening when a rabbit turned up to nibble some grass near the house. One of the cockatoos followed it for nearly ten minutes, occasionally biting its tail or one of its hind feet, then standing with its head cocked on one side watching the rabbit hop off a few paces before repeating the performance. There was no apparent reason, apart from a bit of fun for the cockatoo.




