## Wamboin Community Association President's Paragraphs

It's been a relatively quiet month. Council has adjourned deliberations on the LEP until May 20, and Telstra's DA for the construction of a mobile phone tower on Millpost Hill has been put on hold pending the outcome of a Native Title claim on crown lands in Palerang.

**Traffic Issues on Norton and Macs Reef Roads** — Following representations from a concerned community member, the WCA wrote to the local police requesting a greater presence on our roads. This has been evident in the past couple of months. Given that much of the criticism relating to speeding vehicles has been directed at through traffic from Canberra, it might interest people to know that half of the infringement notices that have been served have involved local residents, and that the five highest speeds recorded have all been for locals.

Wamboin Locality Sign — It was a little disappointing to see council's new Wamboin locality sign vandalised recently. While there was a degree of controversy surrounding Council's decision to erect a sign so close to our own 'Wamboin Wall', this was hardly the best way to deal with the situation. The WCA is negotiating with Council to have the sign moved to a more appropriate location, and to have a 'Wamboin' finger board positioned on the Sutton Road sign post.

Annual Fireworks Night — A great effort by our treasurer Keith France has secured the services of an interstate 'pyrotechnical engineering firm' to support the annual Wamboin Fireworks Night, following the demise of much of the local industry in the wake of the change in ACT laws relating to the sale of fireworks. The grand event will be held, as has become the tradition, on the last Saturday in September. Details will be provided in coming issues of The Whisper, and on the WCA website (http://wamboincommunity.asn.au).

URGENT!!! Macs Reef Road (MRR) Waste Transfer Station is still in jeopardy!!! Please contact your Councillors.... There is strong evidence that council management and some councilors do not want the MRR waste transfer

station to go ahead and are currently active in persuading those who support the WTS to change their minds.

This is all part of the push to quash the replacement of the tip to a waste transfer station and get residents in Bywong and surrounds (3,700 people) to use the Bungendore waste transfer station, as the only council-supported facility, and not have a local option.

## **PONY TALES** - Goings On at WPC

Have you driven down Norton road in old Wamboin and seen the sign on Canning Close - Pony Club What's down there in the cul-de-sac you wonder? Well it's the "Wamboin Pony Club."

Yes like much of the rest of Wamboin there's a lot of rocks, dust, wattle... and more rocks and a few more rocks but at the end of the road there's a little place where a bunch of kids, young adults and some pretty dedicated volunteer instructors and parents gather a couple of times a month to learn lots of horse riding skills.

Pony Club has been around for many years and Canberra and its surrounds has numerous clubs - the Wamboin Pony club has recently celebrated 25 years! not quite as old as the "Whisper" you're reading but not far off.

So what's going on – well I won't bore you with the last 25 years but after a lot of hard work from many in the community over those 25 years the club has built itself a pretty decent set-up – scratched from the scrub – oh and the rocks did I mention those? We've got a Dressage, Jumping and Main Arena area.

We continue to try to build up our cross country jumping course and recently and most excitingly we are extending our club house. This is thanks to some hard work by parents but also thanks to a grant from the Veolia Mulwaree Trust.

When we meet (usually twice a month) there's opportunity to practice and learn a variety of riding skills – Jumping, Dressage, Mounted Games, Cross Country to name a few - we have riders who compete successfully in all of those areas but for the most part it's about having fun and importantly doing it safely.

I think the best thing is that kids, teenagers and young adults 5 to 25 can get together with their horses and ride in a safe environment and learn lots of new skills. Hey anyone who has been around horses will know they can sometimes be a challenge, but it's good to know that if your child joins pony club they can be with a group that will really help them improve their riding skills and don't worry because pony club has riders with all levels of experience.

Over the coming months I will tell you more of the goings on at our club but this month is really about telling those of you in the area - hey we're out here - all you parents who might have kids who are learning to ride and who would like to join our club come along (you do need your own pony or horse however). Our rally days are usually the  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Sunday of the month – next is 9th May.

If you want some more info call our club secretary Louise Baldwin (Ph: 62381509) or Senior Instructor, Robyn Slater (62383472), check out our website www.wamboin.pcansw.org.au or just pop into our next rally day and have a look. I'll probably be the bloke up on the new clubhouse roof putting on the iron along with other dad's. There'll be sausages on the BBQ for lunch and the dedicated instructors and other parents will be around the grounds enjoying the fact that their kids are having fun at our club. Remember Wamboin it's your pony club in your community – see you soon.


And hey all you business' out there we'd love your support. We're still building our new clubhouse and have plenty of other projects on the boil so help with materials or financial support would be appreciated.

A Fire Permit is not required to burn off in the open, but, if you plan to light a fire in the open please notify:

- your neighbours, and
- the Brigade Captain 0409 991 340 or (02) 6238 1849 (ah) at least 24 hours before you light the fire.

Your thoughtfulness will help minimise neighbour anxiety and unnecessary brigade call-outs.

Management, including containment of a fire originating on your property is your responsibility.

# RING TRIPLE ZERO (000) TO REPORT FIRES OR SMOKE SIGHTINGS.

#### BRIGADE ACTIVITY DURING THE PERIOD

After a very quiet first 3 months of the New Year, the Easter break began with an unfortunate bang with two motor vehicle accidents. In the afternoon of Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> April the brigade was asked to respond to a vehicle accident on the 'new' section of Bungendore Road near Snowgum Road. This was a head on collision between two cars. One driver was trapped for over an hour and both drivers were subsequently conveyed to hospital. As traffic diversions needed to be put in place, the accident caused considerable inconvenience to scores of other people, chiefly Canberrans, heading to the coast for the long break.

In the early hours of Saturday 3rd April, the brigade was called to a single vehicle accident involving a car that had veered off the Sutton Road and, having glanced a substantial tree, miraculously landed in a paddock some 15 metres from the road. Interestingly, the fence between the road and the vehicle was still largely intact. It appears the driver had spent some 3 hours trapped in the vehicle before being discovered by a passing motorist.

On Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> April, in the early evening, a grass fire was reported on Macs Reef Road. The brigade responded. Despite travelling the entirety of Macs Reef Road the brigade could not locate the alleged fire and the tanker and its crew returned to the Fireshed.

Fire brigade training is, of course, a year round activity. The cooler season offers brigade members the opportunity to enhance their fire-fighter skills by attending numerous professional development courses offered by the Rural Fire Service. In addition, Autumn provides an opportunity for the Rural Fire Service to conduct hazard reduction burns including a number of which are planned for our area. This provides additional opportunities for brigade members to focus on their skills.

#### FIRE SAFETY AT HOME

Fire safety always starts with you!

Following on from last month, we are concentrating our advice in the winter period on the home with the now familiar theme 'BE PREPARED'.

Keep yourself, your family and your home safe from fire. Children are most at risk of serious injury or death in house fires. Householders need to take extra care as house fires occur more frequently during the colder months.

#### Ten tips for fire safety at home

- Take care in the kitchen. Never leave cooking unattended and always turn pot handles in.
- Supervise children. Children need to be protected from fire, and from the potential for starting fires.
- **Heat your home safely.** Ensure your heater is at least one metre from flammable items such as curtains, furniture, toys and bedding.
- Dispose of cigarettes safely. Wet down cigarette butts before discarding. Never smoke in bed.
- Take care with electricity. Have an electrician check the electrical wiring throughout your home. Keep your home appliances in good working order.
- **Install a smoke alarm.** Smoke alarms save lives! Keep your smoke alarms clean, and test them regularly. If battery-powered, replace batteries at least once a year.
- Plan your home escape. Create an escape plan and practise escaping from your home.
- Use home security that lets you get out quickly. If your home has deadlocks fitted to doors, keep a key in the deadlock so that you can escape quickly in the event of a fire.
- Check portable fire extinguishers. Check the pressure gauge on the extinguisher regularly.
- Be prepared. Know which fire safety equipment to use, and know how to use it.

#### **Train Your Family in Evacuation Procedures:**

Follow the escape plan (you do have one don't you?)

- Alert all others in the building.
- When there is smoke, crawl low to get under the smoke.
- Test for the temperature of each door by using the <u>back</u> of your hand; if the handle is hot do not open it.
- Close the door as you leave a room to prevent fire and smoke from spreading.
- Never go back inside the house, once out stay out.
- Meet at the pre-determined assembly area such as a prominent landmark.
- Make sure <u>all</u> the family know how to call emergency services (ie ring Triple Zero).
- If possible, meet the fire service as it arrives; you have invaluable knowledge that can greatly assist them.

#### Teach your children to 'Stop, Drop and Roll'

Advice to anyone whose clothes are on fire:

- Stop. Don't run as this will fan the flames.
- Drop to the ground and cover your face with your hands.
- Roll over to smother the flames.



#### **LETTER BOXES – What do they say about their owners? (Pt1)**

No doubt you knew that last year was the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Australia's postal service?

Yes, it was in 1809 that the first Postmaster of NSW was appointed. Unsurprisingly I guess, it was a bloke, indeed an ex-convict; his name was Isaac Nichols. Isaac took the post operating from his home in George Street, Sydney. His main job was to take charge of letters and parcels arriving by ship, to avoid the chaos of people rushing onto the ships as soon as they berthed at Sydney's wharves. Apparently, many would purport to be important people, or to have the authority to act (and therefore receive mail) on their 'master's' behalf.

Postal services grew throughout the Australian colonies as they were established. Other key milestones include:

- A regular Sydney-Melbourne overland service began in 1838.
- Monthly steamship sea mail to the United Kingdom was established in 1856.
- In 1901, the colonial mail systems were merged into the Postmaster General (or PMG) responsible for telegraph and domestic telephone operations as well as postal mail.
- The world's first large-scale mechanical mail sorting system was introduced in Australia (according to Australia Post), and operational in the Sydney GPO in 1967. This coincided with the introduction of the current system of 4-digit Postcodes in Australia.
- On 1 July 1975, separate government commissions were created to undertake the operational responsibilities of the PMG. One of these was the Australian Postal Commission (now Corporation), trading as Australia Post.

In a belated recognition of 200 years of mail delivery (including more than 30 years to our immediate area) I present to the reader a small selection of the wizardry gracing the roadsides in our region. I leave it to you to form your opinion of the artwork and to ponder on the likely personality or multiples thereof of each artist. Given the eclectic array of the mail receptacles dotting our locality I can only imagine the challenge that besets the poor old posties as they go about their business, although, it must make for variety.

To protect the innocent (and the guilty) I have withheld the location of the artworks. And, to be fair, my own effort is included.

I hope to bring you a few more examples of the mailbox artistry dotting the region in a future issue of The Whisper.

Our participation on the Bywong Car Boot Sale was as successful as ever and raised a considerable sum which will be used to further the interests of Landcare in the local area, as well as add to our list of donations to the Bungendore School library and similar organisations. Thanks to everyone who purchased plants from us.

The GG/Wamboin Landcare Group has now completed it's obligation to the roadside planting of several hundred trees in the new Birchman's Grove development in Wamboin. The work was finished on Sat. 24<sup>th</sup> April by a number of dedicated volunteers and overall will add considerably to the general ambience of the new development.

We will, in the next few weeks, be adding more shrubs and trees to the plantings in Millynn road and the Les Reardon reserve in Wamboin as well as thinning the very successful planting of trees along the roadside at Smith's Gap. We are always on the lookout for other areas, both public and private, which might benefit from a limited volunteer planting or regeneration.

Final editing is now taking place for the booklet "Look After Your Natural Assets" last produced in association with the Upper Murrumbidgee Catchment Coordinating Committee, Environment ACT, and the Murrumbidgee Catchment Management Board in 2003. The updated version should soon be available and freely distributed in the local region. It will present a wealth of information on landcare for the bush block and small farm acreage in the Murrumbidgee catchment in which we all live. The 2010 edition will be produced with the assistance of funds made available by and ACT Government Environment grant, Cooma Monaro Shire Council, Upper Murrumbidgee LandcareCommittee, Molonglo Catchment Group, Upper Murrumbidgee Waterwatch and ACTEWAGL.

Monthly nursery sessions will continue well into winter this year, with a good start [at the April meeting] being made to our cuttings development of shrubs and bushes. Sessions are held at the nursery at 38 Birchman's Grove Wamboin usually on the first Saturday of each month. Even if you are not on our contact list of Landcare volunteers, you are more than welcome to attend and round out your knowledge of local native plants and trees, and their successful propagation, or bring cuttings from your property. We are always on the lookout for new species to propagate, but we must know [preferably Latin] the full name of the plant. Certain plants cannot be propagated for re-sale. #### Wamboin Muse Jill Gregory

Twelve months ago we travelled through parts of north eastern Victoria and were confronted by the dry and lifeless landscape. We returned recently to cycle the Murray to the Mountains old rail trail, and back, and delighted in a green and mellow countryside. What a difference a little rain can make! I started thinking about recreational cycling trails in our part of the world and the broken threads of the old railway line from Queanbeyan to Cooma and beyond. Old, abandoned railway lines, with their gentle gradients can be transformed into excellent cycle and walking paths...but we need means and a will.

It was while we were riding through a damp area of pines and casuarinas that I spied a beautiful conical shaped fungus, red, with white spots. It looked as if it had been lifted straight out of the English fairy story books of my childhood. I haven't seen one like that around here, as yet, but I am amazed at the number and variety of fungi that I have seen in my garden and the bush this autumn. Walking through the bush there is the distinctive smell of moulds and fungi busily working their magic above and below ground. I have picked and eaten mushrooms as big as entrée plates, obliged puffballs by kicking them with all my might and been fascinated and repulsed at the same time by "dog's vomit" and stinkhorns in my well mulched garden. There is one specimen, however, that has captivated me. It looks exquisite, a perfect, translucent glass like cap supported by a delicate stem. I think it's a Hygrocybe. This morning I saw bright orange plates stacked at the base of a stringybark. What a difference a few good months of rain can make while the ground is still warm and alive.

It hasn't really been cold yet, but I kindled a fire, nevertheless, on the eve of ANZAC day, one day ahead of the traditional fire lighting date. I didn't shiver at the Dawn service this year and lose all feeling in my feet, and I didn't dab my misty eyes with numb fingers as we soberly remembered those who would not grow old. It was a still, clear morning after beautiful overnight rain, and I stood there in silence, my eyes fixed on the Southern Cross in the inky sky as the Last Post sounded. Then, before the Reveille broke the poignant silence, a larrikin kookaburra started to chuckle. I wondered what the young ANZACs, so far from home, would have given for a glimpse of the Southern Cross and the sound of an irreverent kookaburra above the noise, fear, stench and chaos of war.

We are indeed fortunate to live in these easy times, especially now that there is a little moisture in the ground, and although few of us will ever begin to comprehend what they endured and sacrificed for their ideals, I am still glad that we gather in solemn respect on that "one day of the year" to "remember them". And long may that larrikin Aussie streak, which probably fired those young men and spurred them on, remain part of modern Australia.

I wouldn't live anywhere else....
