HISTORIC CONFIRMATION SERVICE AT SUTTON

It was 59 years since a Confirmation service had been held at St Peter's, Sutton. From February 1951 until November 2010 new confirmees from St Peter's had taken preparation classes and been confirmed at St John the Baptist Church, Reid, Canberra, mother church to St Peter's.

On Friday evening 12th November, 2010, a delightful, relaxed and special Confirmation Service was held at St Peter's. Six young people from Sutton school area were presented for Confirmation to Bishop Trevor Edwards, Assistant Bishop of Canberra and Goulburn.

The Confirmation service was the culmination of a period of preparation sessions given by Reverend David Hill, St Peter's Minister and his wife, Barbara. Thanks to Sutton school's Principal the sessions were held at the Sutton school.

Once friends and proud parents were seated, the ceremony began. Holding their confirmation candles the candidates led the clergy into the church. Assisting Bishop Trevor with the service were Reverend Paul Black, Rector of the Parish, and Reverend David Hill, St Peter's Minister. Reverend and Mrs Hill presented the candidates to the Bishop.

Michael Develin, Breanna Reynolds, Kylie Searle, Graeme Searle, Jodie Taylor and Peter Zahra were then confirmed into the Anglican Church by the Bishop. While Ayla Lucas did not ask for confirmation, she joined her classmates to receive a blessing from the Bishop. Each new confirmee was welcomed by St Peter's congregation with the gift of a Bible.

In February 1951 the confirmees were: Bob Read, Ashley Gorman, Ted Donley, Beverley Fletcher, Noeline Kershaw and Kay Hardy were confirmed by Bishop Burgman.

It is hoped that the 2010 Confirmation will be followed by many more at St Peter's. Reverend and Mrs Hill are already looking forward to a 2011 Confirmation service. DID YOU ATTEND THE BUSH FIRE PREPAREDNESS MEETING ON 20 NOVEMBER?

The first of the bush fire awareness/preparedness community meetings was held on Saturday 20th November at the Fire Station. A small but enthusiastic and interested group of residents took time out from their routine to understand how to best prepare themselves, their family, home and property for the threat of bush fire in the coming weeks and months. There were lots of questions answered by the local fire brigade.

The brigade presentations emphasized the latest advice on bush fire safety and stressed the importance of managing the prevailing conditions. Residents heard that the conditions that produced the Victorian bush fires of February 2009 also produced hazardous conditions for the unwell, the elderly and the young. More people died in Victoria in February 2009 as a result of the severe weather conditions than the bush fires themselves.

It is a matter of planning for extreme weather conditions and their effect than for a particular event caused by those weather conditions.

If resident feedback stands for anything, the 15 minute video the Brigade ran at the beginning of the session, brought home the reality of the trauma of bush fire and the importance of being prepared.





Tomatoes

Just for the record, I picked my first ripe cherry tomatoes on the 28th of November. Yes, they were small and fairly rough but Larry King says size doesn't matter. Roughness? That's another matter. The tomatoes we are picking now are much better quality but a week later.

This season, for the first time, I tried the upside-down system of growing two types of tomato from the bases of hanging bags. For comparison I grew the same type of tomato in the ground. The upside-down ones matured a little earlier however the plants don't look near as healthy and the fruit is not as well formed as the ones planted in the ground. I would be interested to hear from anyone who has tried this system. Maybe they can point out what I am doing wrong. -- Lofty Mason.



Nature Notes – November 2010

Jo Walker

Spring continues to be beyond any expectations we've held for a long while. The rains continued into November, and, because the temperatures have been so mild, the local plants have had a relatively long flowering season.

In the damper areas, the Buttercups, Bulbine Lilies (*Bulbine bulbosa*) and Billy Buttons (*Craspedia variabilis*) have almost finished flowering now, and their place is being taken by yellow Scaly Buttons (*Leptorhynchos squamatus*) and the golden, star-shaped flowers of the little *Hypoxis hygrometrica*.

On the drier slopes, the white flowers of Prickly Starwort (*Stellaria pungens*) are more noticeable than they have been for some years. These flowers are somewhat daisy-like, but this little plant, which can sucker over a wide area, is actually in the carnation family (Caryophyllaceae). And, of course, the real daisies are coming into their own right now – most spectacularly the Sticky Everlastings (*Xerochrysum viscosum*), their golden papery flowers adorning long stretches of the roadways around Wamboin. Over the past twenty years, these and other daisy species have proliferated in the region, probably because daisies are more drought-tolerant than many other plants.

There have been plenty of orchids in evidence too. I counted over seventy Tiger Orchids (*Diuris sulphurea*) amongst the Red-anther Wallaby-grass tussocks on my place, and Musky Caps (*Stegostyla moschata*), named for the musky scent of the flowers, is growing in the forest just over the fence. Two Needle-point Rustyhoods (*Oligochaetochilus aciculiformis*) made an appearance, and several pale blue Slender Sun Orchids (*Thelymitra pauciflora*) flowered in wet seepage areas after many years of absence.

The birds are all still busy feeding nestlings and fledglings. Although I haven't seen their nest, the White-eared Honeyeaters are disappearing into the bushes near the creek with beakfuls of insects, so presumably they have young ones there. Four Ravens recently came searching for food in front of the house – a pair of adults with two extremely vociferous young ones begging for food. The Pied Currawong population seems to have increased lately, not a good thing for the lizards and other small creatures – one bird flew past me under the carport a few days ago with the limp body of a small lizard clamped firmly in its beak. Currawongs have a habit of regurgitating large pellets of undigested food, usually full of a variety of seed. At present, they consist mainly of the green skins and woody seed of the Cherry Ballart (*Exocarpos cupressiformis*). There were 74 seed in one pellet, so there might be a few small forests around in the near future!

Years ago, there were several Red-browed Finches here. They nested, reared their young very successfully, and the population grew to over twenty birds. Then one day, they all took off and didn't return. But, last week, a pair of these attractive little birds were feeding in the garden. I've seen them once or twice since, so hope they start the process again and produce another little flock.

Wamboin Muse by Jill Gregory

A few days until the official start of summer, but from my window I am looking out onto a wet and wintry world. The low, leaden sky has smothered the distant hills, and the trees and bushes are sagging, heavy with rain. Yet only a few nights ago I was driving home to brilliant sunsets.... one night an orange painted sky held together with brush strokes of grey, the next a brilliant deep pink morphing into purple, and then a sunset sky of bleached blue and pale gold. And the night air was warm and damp, fragrant with the smell of drying grass.

But even if the weather is trying to confuse us, there are other more reliable signs that Christmas is just around the corner. I now drive with greater caution, looking out for lizards of all types sunning themselves on the early morning road. One, more streetwise than its mates, chose to drape itself instead on a sunny letterbox. The fledgling galahs have started their monotone grizzles, the air is thick with flying insects and red bottle brushes and yellow black wattles are in flower. Fringing the road yellow paper daisies and bush peas add patches of sunshine. But where are the pretty blue wrens? They seem to have disappeared from my garden this spring.

It's a busy time of the year, not just with Christmas preparations and end of year deadlines and festivities, but trying to keep one step ahead of the grass. Even the kangaroos can't tame the energy of all the grasses this year.
