

#### Darryl Bourke, President This News Put Together by the Bywong Committee



**Mad March Hares**. Believe it or not, it's time for the sixteenth Bywong Car Boot Sale. Every year this event brings out the best and worst from peoples' sheds, but only the best from their natures. And every year it gets bigger and better. The date is Sunday 20 March and the venue Bywong Hall in Birriwa Road.

The February meeting of the Community Committee commended the sterling work being carried out by coordinators Pauline Chambers and Kerrie Gougeon and endorsed a number of new features which they have introduced. (See separate feature elsewhere in the Whisper for details.).

**Jazzing up our Hall.** The Community has succeeded in its application for a government grant to refurbish and improve the facilities of Bywong Hall at the Les Reardon Reserve. The application for the grant was made by the Community in its status as a community organisation, but proposals for the grant were made in conjunction with the Hall Committee, which is the committee of Council charged with running the Hall. The grant, amounting to \$10,443 is for the refurbishment of the kitchen, principally through the installation of a new stove and larger size cooktop and for a variety of works to enhance the structure and grounds and improve the performance of the septic. The Community, which is a regular user of the Hall, will carry out the work jointly with the Hall Committee.

A Cleaner Home. By the time this hits the mailboxes, we hope that our efforts on Clean Up Australia Day will have borne fruit, and that Bywong will be a better and cleaner place. This year three Bywong sites were registered with Clean Up Australia – at Macs Reef Road, Bungendore Road and the Old Federal Highway. This arrangement linked our community to the wider national effort, and enabled volunteers to register on line.

**GROWing our Greenways.** GROW, a group organised under the auspices of the Community to promote, enjoy and and extend our local greenways, will be conferring with Council's S.355 Greenways Committee to integrate the activities of the two organisations.

Weeds On Road Verges. The Committee considered a proposal from a local resident that the Community should sponsor a programme for local residents to join in spraying weeds on verges outside their properties. The Secretary advised that Council has reservations on Occupational Health and Safety grounds about non-insured residents using spray and working on verges adjacent to connecting roads. For these reasons, the Committee regretfully decided it could not support the proposal, and will advise the resident accordingly.

**Meetings.** The next Committee meeting is on 14 March, and local residents are welcome to attend. The AGM is scheduled for 10 October.





#### **BUSH FIRE PREPARATION/AWARENESS INFORMATION SESSIONS**

On Saturday Feb 19<sup>th</sup> the Brigade ran the final of a set of three information sessions conducted over this bush fire danger period. The sessions are designed to inform the community on the serious business of being bush fire aware and prepared. The first two sessions were held in November and December last year. It was a keen audience at the February event, none of whom had attended before and roughly half of whom were relatively recent arrivals to the area. Members of the community who attended the sessions now know more about:

- the bush fire threat/history of fire and the high risk areas in our region;
- what the Fire Danger Ratings are, what they mean, and how you should respond;
- how to prepare for bush fires;
- bush fire decision-making;
- how to act in the event of a bush fire; and
- myths versus reality.

We've been running these information sessions for the past several years now so if you haven't taken the opportunity to come along to at least one of them we trust it is because you and your family are well versed and prepared for the eventuality because we all live in a bush fire prone area.

#### Please take great care

In case you were unaware, the brigade has already responded to two grass fires during the current fire danger period. Fortunately, both fires have been contained and dealt with quickly. Given the high and now very dry grass this year, a couple of warm days and some wind could create an environment conducive to a potentially nasty fire danger condition.

#### **RFS AIDER Programme**

**RFS Help For Aged and Disabled Residents To Reduce Bush Fire Hazards:** Aged residents and residents with disabling conditions in particular are more vulnerable to the impact of bush fires. Where someone does not have the capacity or support to reduce bush fire hazards, the NSW Rural Fire Service (RFS) may be able to help.

**AIDER Programme (Assist Infirm Disabled and Elderly Residents (AIDER) - helping aged and disabled residents:** The RFS '**AIDER Programme'** (Assist Infirm Disabled and Elderly Residents) is a one-off free service, supporting vulnerable residents to live more safely and confidently in their home on bush fire prone land. AIDER work is one-off and includes such things as clearing gutters, thinning vegetation, removing leaf and tree debris, trimming branches from around and overhanging the home, mowing or slashing long grass.



#### Wamboin Muse Jill Gregory

Our yoga teacher farewelled the class with the suggestion to "tread lightly" this week, but I can assure you that I trod anything but lightly when I crossed the trickling creek this morning and waded through thick grass to the overgrown and neglected orchard hoping that mother nature had been generous to the undeserving this year. I wore my stoutest boots with my jeans tucked in to my longest socks and I outdid any determined dinosaur with my dinosaur stomp! I didn't hear the grass rustle, nor did I spy anything slithering through it, but it's amazing how a length of long abandoned irrigation hose, lying in the grass, with a slick of glistening snail trail along its length can stir the blood!! I came back, mercifully, in one piece, shoulders drooping under the weight of bags full of apples, peaches, nashis and plums. All the fruit was "certified organic". The only fertiliser over the past few years has been courtesy of passing kangaroos, and the only pesticides, birds. How kind the season has been to us this year.

I have, over the years, tried a bit of companion planting in a less than scientific sort of way. Good neighbours support each other and create harmony in an environment. I discovered a punnet of marigolds in a nursery and vaguely recalled that they should be planted next to roses. The marigolds grew and the roses bloomed and I imagined that there were fewer aphids and black spots, but then I read that it should've been garlic and overnight the aphids appeared and sucked the roses dry! I planted and nurtured tomato seedlings, but suddenly rogue potatoes appeared and grew up around and through them, and I had feelings of disquiet. I was right for once, but not only had I mixed antagonistic potatoes with tomatoes, I had compounded the cultural mismatch by growing corn and pumpkins in the same bed. Fortunately our neighbours across the creek are more methodical and they grow very good vegetables, but we are still able to do some trading; a few eggs for keeping an eye on our chooks in our absence, organic apples for an armful of basil.

Good neighbours are invaluable. Robert Frost once said, "Good fences make good neighbours", but there isn't a fence between us and our neighbours, only a poor excuse for a creek. Over many years we have developed a special friendship. We've celebrated family joys, and commiserated over sorrows, swapped stories of broken pumps and septic systems, shared blackouts and battles with Telstra, prayed for rain together then prayed for it to stop, and together tried, against all reason, to create an exotic garden in the bush. But the time has come for them to pack up half a lifetime of memories and move. Wamboin is both a magnet and haven for hoarders and collectors, a "let's build another shed" can-do type of place, somewhere to be yourself and indulge your "little ways" far removed from straight-jacketed suburbia. Our neighbours have tolerated all that from across the creek.

I can't imagine that leaving here would ever be easy. However, nothing stays the same, and after a frightening fire, years of plenty and years of steadily worsening drought, the good times have come again and it's time for them to move.

I wouldn't live anywhere else....and I know one couple who will have heavy hearts as they farewell wonderful Wamboin to live somewhere else. I only hope they have trunks large enough to store all their carefully wrapped treasured memories. ...and find good neighbours waiting for them.
