

Greenways Walk Sunday 18th September: Join members of the Greenways Renewal Group on an organised walk to explore the Millpost Hill track. Check out the spectacular scenery and learn about our local Flora and Fauna, as well as experiencing our wonderful local asset.


Either 9.30am meet at Bywong Community Hall car park. Estimated walk time is about three hours return (including 1hr for Morning tea Or - 10.00am meet at end of Majors Close. Estimated walk time is about 2 hours return (including 1hr for Morning tea). For those who would like to take a more leisurely pace and explore the plants and learn about local birds with our resident expert. We will then join the convoy at the top of Millpost hill. Wear good walking shoes and bring other items you might need like suncream, hats and water. Families welcome. Bring refreshments for a light morning tea on the top of Millpost Hill.

**GROW** met at the Bywong Hall on 2 August to discuss how to progress expanding the current Greenways network in Bywong and Wamboin. We have an opportunity now to put forward some proposed areas for Greenways to the NSW Dept. of Lands for them to review the current legal status of those lands, and to discuss how we might progress to the benefit of evervone.

This is the first step of many in this process, and all parties involved – residents, landholders, other user groups and Palerang Council will be included in discussions about any possible options before anything is decided or acted on. GROW welcomes your involvement, and constructive comments and feedback from all residents about this matter.

#### WAMBOIN HALL KITCHEN UPGRADE

The attached photos show that considerable progress has been made. The only extra wrecking as listed last Whisper was the removal of the servery roller shutter and surrounding trim. We have now replaced and painted all wall and ceiling panels, painted the floor and installed the cupboard shells. The ceiling lights have been replaced and new power points fitted. These power points include one in Hall for the heater and one on the entry veranda.



The stainless steel bench-tops and servery shelf were delivered the day before I wrote this report. By the time you read this we plan to have these stainless steel fittings installed and hopefully the doors and draws fitted to the cupboards. Hank Berlee has joined the list of workers since he returned from Queensland and Councillor Pete Harrison has taken on the repair of plaster and the painting of doors and architraves.

Future work includes the fitting of sliding doors in the servery window, the manufacture and fitting of cupboards in the entry plus a mop drying rack outside. Finally we also plan to renew the leaking gutter along the south side of the Hall. And that I hope will be the finish of this project. -- Lofty Mason, Project Officer.

## Wamboin Local Finishes Badwater Ultra Marathon in Death Valley California by Gabrielle Burns

Congratulations to Pam Muston, a well-known local identity, who has just returned from the United States where she participated in and completed the Badwater Ultra Marathon in Death Valley, California.

It was a beautiful summer's day in Death Valley when Pam started her race. The thermometer showed 48 degrees in the shade, but Pam powered through the heat and sun, past the sand dunes and salt lakes and made good progress on the long straight roads through the desert. Through the night the temperature dipped slightly as Pam climbed the winding road over the bare desolate hills, the light from her head torch guiding her way through the darkness. At dawn the next day, the sun rose over the desert to reveal more sand dunes, more heat and many cars and trucks racing down the highway through the desert on their way to Los Angeles. As one local in

through the desert on their way to Los Angeles. As one local in Las Vegas said when we told him we were travelling to Death Valley, "Hell, nobody gets out of their car on that highway!"




Covering 217km non-stop through Death Valley to Mt. Whitney, California, the Badwater Ultramarathon is a most demanding and extreme running race. The start line is at Badwater, Death Valley, which marks the lowest elevation in the Western Hemisphere at 85m below sea level. The race passes through fascinating little outback desert towns such as Furnace Creek, Stovepipe Wells, (can you feel the heat?!) Panamint Springs, Lone Pine and the race finishes at the Mt. Whitney Portals at nearly 2530m. The Badwater course crosses three mountain ranges for a total of 3962m cumulative vertical ascent



Pam's Support Crew (consisting of Michael, Jack and Clare Muston, Gabrielle Burns and Peter Szydlik and our local Las Vegas contact, Tim Duffy), followed Pam (in a car) through Death Valley and kept her cool with iced water, wet head cloths and kind words of encouragement throughout the race. Pam's final climb up Mt Whitney and over the Finish Line was very exciting. In a field of 95 male and female contestants from all over the world, many of whom were competing for the second or third time, Pam finished 39th overall and the 10th female, in a time of 37 hours and 49 minutes.

Thankyou to the local people of Wamboin who supported Pam in her preparations for this amazing race (giving her encouragement and some even accompanying her in her pre race running in the forest in the dead of night) Thankyou also to our local business supporter, Inland Trading Company.



#### BUSH FIRE DANGER PERIOD BROUGHT FORWARD

The Wamboin Volunteer Rural Fire Brigade wishes to advise local residents that the 2011 / 2012 fire season for the Lake George Zone (LGZ) has been brought forward - to begin on the 1st of September 2011. The LGZ includes all localities in the brigade's area i.e. Bywong, Sutton (south of the Federal Highway) and Wamboin.

Unusually high fuel loads in the region, and the expected dry conditions over the coming months are the main factors for the decision to bring the start of the fire season forward one month.

One of the impacts of this decision is that from the 1st of September lighting of open fires or hazard reduction activities undertaken in the region without a permit is in violation of the law. 'Burning off' or any lighting of fires in the open will require a Fire Permit from the Brigade. Please phone the brigade Captain for advice on obtaining a Fire Permit on 0409 991 340.

Residents should be aware of the inherent risk this coming fire season poses, and we remind all to follow fire safe practices when working with equipment and machinery outside in the region.

The Brigade holds regular attendance on Wamboin market days for anyone wishing to enquire about fire safety. It will also be conducting a number of specialised and focused information sessions at various times during the fire season to keep local residents informed. These sessions will begin from mid September (see below).

All residents should have a fire survival plan to protect their family, friends, animals and property from bush and other fires. ## BUSHFIRE PREPARATIONS


PREPARE. ACT. SURVIVE.

**PREPARE.** It is your responsibility to prepare yourself, your family and your home for the threat of bush fire. Every home must have a <u>Bush Fire Survival Plan</u> encompassing the decision to either "Leave Early" or to "Stay and Defend" to ensure you are prepared and know what to do in the event of a bush fire. You also need a contingency plan in the event your primary plan is not able to be implemented.

*ACT.* You need to act decisively in accordance with your Bush Fire Survival Plan when bush fires threaten. *SURVIVE.* Your survival depends on your preparations, and the decisions you make.

Regardless of your decision, you must prepare your property to give you, your family and your home the best chance of survival. The RFS has produced guidance on the preparations and actions that you need to take in order to survive a bush fire. #### FIRE DANGER RATING



The Fire Danger Rating is an early indicator of potential danger. It is an assessment of the potential fire behaviour, the difficulty of suppressing a fire, and the potential impact on the community should a bush fire occur on a given day. The Fire Danger Rating is determined by the Fire Danger Index (FDI). The FDI is a combination of air temperature, relative humidity, wind speed and drought. When a Fire Danger Rating is advised, you need to take it seriously and be prepared to act. It should act as your first trigger for action. The Fire Danger Rating signs for our area are located near the intersections of:

- Norton Rd and Sutton Rd (Wamboin)
- Macs Reef Rd and Harriott Rd (Bywong)
- Bungendore Rd and Joe Rocks Rd (Bungendore)
- Bungendore Rd and Summerhill Rd (Bywong), and
- Federal Hwy Service Rd and Goolabri Dr (Sutton Park).

In addition, the brigade will be offering both static and working displays of a range of portable pump, hose and nozzle setups from 9am - 10.30 am and these will resume following the community-wide bush fire information session at around 1pm. If you haven't attended a previous session or think you would benefit from a refresher, you owe it to yourself, your family and other people in your community to come to this event.

#### **BUSH FIRE ALERTS**

Bush fire alerts are about getting messages to the community when there is a fire, using a wide range of media such as the web, radio and television. Bush fires can threaten suddenly and without warning, so people must be prepared to take action whether they receive an official emergency warning or not.

The decision to issue a Bushfire Alert is based on the threat posed by a fire. It considers the current <u>Fire Danger Rating</u> and the predicted rate of spread of the fire, which can vary depending on topography, fuel type, prolonged drought and other local conditions.

The messaging levels are designed with safety in mind, whilst acknowledging that over-warning can lead to complacency and delays in people taking action.

### **Emergency Warning**

Advice	A fire has started. There is no immediate danger.	
Watch & Act	A heightened level of threat. Conditions are changing; you need to start taking action now to protect you and your family. Follow your Bush Fire Survival Plan.

#### **BRIGADE ACTIVITY LAST MONTH**

#### **CALL OUTS:**

Your brigade responded to three Triple Zero (000) callouts during the month.

**On Friday 8 August** - circa 2.30pm the brigade responded to a report of a <u>smoke sighting</u> on the Federal Highway in the vicinity of Donnelly Road. After an extensive search, the smoke was found to be coming from a small controlled burn by a

property owner not far from the intersection of the Federal Highway and Bungendore Road. After reviewing the situation and discussion with the owner the situation was considered to be safe allowing the brigade to return to the Fire Station. On Monday 15 August — around 4.20pm there was a report of grass alight near Eaglehawk on the Federal Highway. The brigade located grass/reeds alight and assisted Rydges Eaglehawk Resort staff to quell the fire located between the resort and the service station.

On Thursday 25 August at approximately 3.15pm, the brigade was requested to respond to assist several other brigades in the Lake George Zone fight a large bush and running grass fire that started on land at Boro, south of Tarago. The brigade sent its two smaller fire fighter tankers and a heavy tanker. Ironically, the nature of the ground in this area combined with last week's rain led to one of our smaller tankers and a number of other

tankers from the other brigades getting bogged at various times during the quest to bring the fire under control. The photos below, taken just before 6pm, are of a small portion of the fire that had run or spotted into bushland.





In our last article we mentioned that the brigade was called to a report of a <u>car on fire</u> on Sutton Rd late on a Sunday night and that the vehicle, believed to be a Range Rover, was burnt out. Below are two photos taken of the vehicle the following day. Two things to observe are that the fire was extremely intense and that the vehicle was totally destroyed with much of the soft metal of the vehicle's panels and engine having disintegrated under the intensity of fire. It's also really

important to be aware that some very nasty toxic fumes are given off when vehicle componentry including plastics etc burns or is exposed to intense heat.





Feeling the heat

Brigade members have attended a number of <u>pile burns</u> during the cooler months as people prepare their properties ahead of the bush fire danger period. The photo below is not out of focus nor is the camera faulty. What you see here is intense flame and an incredible amount of heat generated from a relatively modest pile burn last month. And all this in benign conditions!

**Wanderings:** Members are off travelling again in Europe and Australia, while some came back with tales of New York City, Malaysia, Europe and a circuit of Australia.



#### Land for Wildlife Takes Off

It was great to see so many people at the Bowing Community Hall on Friday 26th to hear John Asquith, from the Community Environment Network, talk about the Land for Wildlife program that is gathering momentum in NSW – and in Wamboin & Bywong. As mentioned in previous issues, LFW is a voluntary property registration scheme for landowners who wish to manage part or all of their property in an environmentally friendly way and for the benefit of biodiversity and wildlife habitat. It is a low-level entry scheme; free to join; and not legally binding. Qualifying landowners are presented with a sign in recognition of their commitment.



A pilot scheme is underway in Wamboin and Bywong - albeit anyone can express an interest by completing the form found on the LFW website, and several landowners have had their properties assessed. At the presentation, John was able to present the first batch of LFW signs to qualifying residents (see photo). There are many more property assessments in the pipeline and it is great to see the LFW program get a foothold in Palerang. There is still much work to be done to bed the scheme down in our region and there is a need to find a regional provider who will administer the program locally, but we are hopeful one will be found soon.

At the meeting it was a good opportunity to thank

Phil Machin, Mel Hillery, Jo Walker and Kris Nash for their work in helping to get LFW off the ground. Jo and Kris have been busy carrying out the property assessments and landowners have found this interaction really useful. An on-the-ground assessment is quite valuable. It will list the plants, grasses, shrubs and trees on the property, discuss how to improve habitat and give advice to overcome problem areas, such as erosion. Maya Beretta (NSW Conservation Partnership Officer at the Queanbeyan Office of Environment & Heritage) has also carried out several property assessments in the area.

#### WAMBOIN GOLF





I should have been at my desk hours ago, but the unblemished blue sky and golden sunshine just begged me to be outdoors. I rather wish that the hens were a little more discreet about broadcasting their cleverness, however, as I have to be quick to beat the beady eyed choughs and ravens (not crows!) to the eggs that they lay. I tolerate the battalion of choughs that plough through my garden, but I draw the line at daylight robbery, especially when they dine well on the titbits I throw to their productive feathered friends.

With the onset of spring the garden summons. It's then that you discover that while little has been happening above ground over winter, plenty has been happening below, and not all of it desirable. I get caught out every year! I thought the severe frosts might have killed off some of the undesirables, but they are the hardiest. I've lost several correas and other native plants, but the list of "Plants that become Weeds" in my gardening bible are alive and well in my plot; peruvian lily, wandering jew, periwinkle, honeysuckle and blackberry. Beware of that cunning, vicious blackberry! It stealthily wove its way through the summer shrubs and is suddenly visible amongst the leafless branches. I attacked it, but I think I came off second best judging by the lacerations to my hands and arms. Next spring I know that I will face the same battle all over again. Those dear little birds that I welcome into my garden will make sure of that!

Although I haven't been able to spend much time at home, lately, let alone potter in the garden or walk through the bush, I look forward to staying put for a while and enjoying a Wamboin spring, full of life, beauty.... and challenges.......I wouldn't live anywhere else!
