





Wildcare's Tawny Tale

Mr Stinky is an Australian Tawny Frogmouth (Podargus strigoides), which are found all over Australia. Generally there are three types of frogmouths - the Tawny, the Marbled (found near Brisbane) and the Papuan Frogmouth (occupying the area between Carpentaria and Townsville). Tawny Frogmouths are medium to big birds with a wingspan of 65-98 cm. They live up to 10 years in the wild and are active at night. They are called frogmouths because of their big mouths and they hunt mostly



ground dwelling animals, like large insects, spiders, frogs and other small animals. This one is called Mr Stinky for obvious reasons. Frogmouths watch, listen and glide down silently to take their prey on the ground.

Wildcare received a call about Mr Stinky in the early hours of an April morning. Mr Stinky was found caught in barbwire on a property in Yass and was quickly rushed to the vets. He had a 3cm rip in his neck area, which had to be sewn up and then treated with antibiotics. Since then he has been in the care of Wildcare waiting the day he can be released back into the wild.

As soon as Mr Stinky's wound has healed completely, and there are no scabs, he will be released back into the wild, as close as possible to the property where he was found. As Mr Stinky's carer, Elso said, "Wildcare loves looking after native Australian birds and I myself would not do anything else. I am fortunate to get the opportunity to work with all sorts of amazing birds. And if you are interested in looking after birds yourself, or want to

learn more about the birds surrounding you, get in touch with Wildcare's bird coordinator (<u>birds@wildcare.com.au</u>). Maryanne can tell you all about how you can get involved."

Advising Fire Control of a Burn Off





Mobile Phone Tower for Wamboin and Bywong Not Funded In 1st Round of Federal Government's Mobile Phone \$100M Blackspots Program

(From Press Release)

Federal Member for Hume Angus Taylor has announced 18 mobile phone towers for Hume.

Mr Taylor said the towers would be located at:

This is a great result, amongst the highest number of any electorate in Australia. We have lobbied long and hard for this – and the Government has listened. Towers will be located for maximum signal spread and the benefit will be shared by many of us because coverage will extend along a number of roads and highway sections, including:

- Burley Griffin Way between Harden and Bowning
- Crookwell Road between Goulburn and Crookwell
- George Russell Drive between Woodstock and Canowindra
- Goulburn Oberon Road between Goulburn, Taralga and Oberon
- Goulburn Road between Binda and Trunkey Creek
- Grenfell-Orange Road between Grenfell and Gooloogong
- Lachlan Valley Way between Cowra and Boorowa
- Merriganowry Road between Lachlan Valley Way and Canowindra Rd
- Mid Western Highway between Lyndhurst and Woodstock
- Murringo Road between Boorowa and Young
- Oallen Ford Road between Nerriga and Tarago
- Olympic Highway between Wattamondara and Koorawatha
- Picton Road between Picton and Fire Road intersection
- Range Road between Bannister and Mummel
- Sandy Point Road intersection of Sandy Point Rd and Oallen Ford Rd

In total, 74 of the 139 mobile black spots nominated in Hume will receive coverage via handheld phones or via an external antenna on the roof or car (or both). The total funding package to Hume is \$10.41 million, including \$2.76 million from the Federal Government under the *Mobile Black Spot Programme*.

Mr Taylor said the 18 base station locations would mean coverage to all or part of the following locations which had been nominated as black spots: Bannister, Belimbla Park, Bendick Murrell, Big Hill, Bigga, Billimari, Binalong, Blue Mountains National Park South, Boro Creek Valley, Breadalbane, Bumbaldry, Bungonia, Bungonia National Park, Buxton, Canyonleigh, Caragabal, Cultowa, Dalton, Darbys Falls, Fullerton, Godfreys Creek, Golspie, Goulburn, Grabine, Greenwich Park, High Range, Laggan, Lakesland, Limerick, Lost River, Lower Boro, Mayfield, Middle Arm, Morongla Creek, Mount Hunter, Mummel, Murringo, Nattai, Noonbinna East Road, Oallen, Peelwood, Pheasants Nest, Picton, Razorback, Roslyn, Taralga, Tarlo, The Oaks, Theresa Park, Thirlmere, Towrang, Wheeo, Wilton, Windellama and Wyangala.

"We will be dramatically improving mobile phone coverage across a vast area of the electorate and I am delighted to be able to share such good news," Mr Taylor said.

He said in addition to the \$100 million in Commonwealth funding for Round 1 of the national programme, a further \$60 million had today been announced for Round 2. Round 2 of the *Mobile Black Spot Programme*, and Telstra's commitment to build 200 new 4G mini base stations, will offer further opportunities to meet unmet demand and provide coverage to more locations around regional and remote Australia. "For those areas which missed out, I will be making a strong case that they are funded in Round 2." Mr Taylor said the first base stations would be built in late 2015 and the full programme rolled out over three years

Editor's Note: In a response to a query from me for any comment on why Wamboin missed out, Sara Bucknell, Media and Communications Officer for Angus Taylor's office, emailed the following:

"There is good news for Hume but Wamboin will have to wait for Round 2. Virtually the first response from Angus was: what about Wamboin? I will send through a statement tomorrow from Angus because we know the community will be upset there isn't good news just yet. Unfortunately we were never going to get all projects up in Round 1. I am attaching to this email a statement (just below) from the Prime Minister about the next round.

"Those black spot locations which have not received coverage under Round 1 will continue to form part of the database, and this database will again be used in the process of determining locations to receive funding under Round 2 of the Mobile Black Spot Programme."

"Sorry I can't be the bearer of gladder tidings – yet."

Food for Thought

Many will have read the May 19 (2015) Canberra Times article, "Queanbeyan and Canberra most dangerous spots for animal road crashes".

Insurer AAMI claimed that their 2014 crash data showed that the Queanbeyan postcode of 2620 "...was the most dangerous spot in Australia for animal crashes".

Putting aside our initial frustration at the article's designation of 2620 as Queanbeyan's postcode (the postcode area starts before the north end of Lake George, covers Gundaroo, Sutton, Wamboin, Queanbeyan, Royalla, Burra, Williamsdale and all surrounding areas, finishing between Michelago and Bredbo, and encompasses some of the ACT), our immediate response was one of disbelief, that a major newspaper would resort to sensational and selective reporting by (*with respect to Benjamin Disraeli*) resorting to "lies, damned lies, and statistics."

Surely the vast majority of road crashes don't involve animals? So why would these statistics be reported in this manner? Aren't most motor vehicle insurance claims – for which we all pay via seemingly exponential increases in our insurance premiums, the result of crashes with other vehicles and stationary objects? Well guess what? They are!

Contacting AAMI for clarification, their spokesperson, Rueben Aitchison, advised, "Animal collisions typically make up around 4% of all our motor accident claims across the country, but in non-urban areas with high concentrations of wildlife, such as the 2620 postcode, we will see a significant jump in numbers as a proportion of all claims. Most fender benders etc. happen in the cities and burbs, (sic.) but there are comparatively few in more rural areas."

This additional detail helps to make some sense of the statistics. Those of us who live in the Whisper distribution area know that there is a higher risk of encountering an animal on our local roads than in urban areas [interestingly though, only about 2% of reported accidents in the ACT involve animals].

The AAMI news article did remind us of the extra care needed when driving in our rural and rural-residential areas. While attention and vigilance as a driver is always necessary, it's especially important to remain alert for hazards, including wildlife and other animals such as straying dogs, at dawn and dusk and through the night.

AAMI's media release pointed out the need to slow down in areas where animals are often seen. These locations are well signposted and well known to local residents.

But, as a driver, did you ever wonder why an animal suddenly appears in your field of view? The Monash Injury Research Institute (Tandy Pok Arundell) wrote this thought-provoking comment: "If occurring at night time, the issue is that people are outrunning their headlights. Firstly, when country driving you should be on high beams whenever possible. Otherwise, say your headlights illuminate 50m ahead, at 100km/h you're travelling at 28m/s. That gives you 1.8s to recognise that the end of your light has illuminated say, a kangaroo's foot and for you to make a decision and act accordingly.



Even if you've perceived and reacted in 1.5s and planted your foot firmly on the brakes, in the 0.3s you've only slowed to 92km/h."

And in terms of mitigating the causes of 96 percent of road crashes, such as reducing the risk of running into the vehicle ahead, the Australian Road Users' Handbook says we need to leave a three second gap - four seconds at night. Tips from another major insurer, Allianz, suggest there are many factors affecting pulling up time and

distance, including speed, road surface, weather, vehicle type and driver reaction time. At 60km/h, stopping distance is 56 metres; at 80km/h it's 88 metres and at 100km/h it's a whopping 127 metres.

So, what's the bottom line when it comes to avoiding collisions involving animals?

Well, the chance of encountering an animal on the road in rural areas is higher than urban areas. But slowing down - particularly in poor visibility and bad weather; keeping good braking distance from the vehicle in front; taking notice of warning signs; reducing in-car distractions; and actively looking out ahead and to the side will markedly reduce the likelihood of being caught out.
